## **Yard Waste**

The City of Springfield's fall leaf pick up will begin in **November.** Please visit the City's website for exact dates of collection. Only during this time will yard waste bags be collected without a sticker. Until this time, please continue to use your waste hauler and sticker for pick up.

Residents can drop off yard waste at Evans Recycling for free during the month of November.

# **Branch Pick Up**

Residential branch pick up will be on a three to five week pick up schedule, **May through October.** A map indicating where branch pick up will occur in your area is posted on the City's website. Visit,

# LEAF PICK UP FAQ'S

#### When is the City's leaf pick up?

The City's leaf pick up will occur during the entire month of November.

#### Where do I place my bags for pick up?

Leaf bags should be placed on the city right of way, between the sidewalk and the street. Do not place them in the street or on private property.

#### What size and type of containers are acceptable?

Leaves should be placed in paper yard waste bags only. Leaves will not be collected if they are not bagged.

#### How do I dispose of sweet gum balls?

Gumballs should be placed in the yard waste bags with your leaves.

#### Are bushes, flowers, and/or grass acceptable?

Please keep to a minimum.

#### When is the free drop off at Evans?

Evans will accept leaves free of charge during the month of November, only.

### How often will they collect my leaf bags?

Ideally, leaf bags will be collected once per week. Many factors can alter this, such as weather. Once the bags have been placed out by the curb, please leave them until they are collected.

### Do I need to call and schedule a pick up?

No. Public Works will not schedule pick ups.

### What if I did not get my leaves out in time?

If you miss the city pick up in November, you can still drop off your bags at Evans Recycling. Otherwise you will need to place a yard waste sticker on the bags and have your waste hauler collect them.

### When do my leaves need to be set out for pick up?

Place your leaves on the city right of way by 6am each Monday morning during the month of November.
